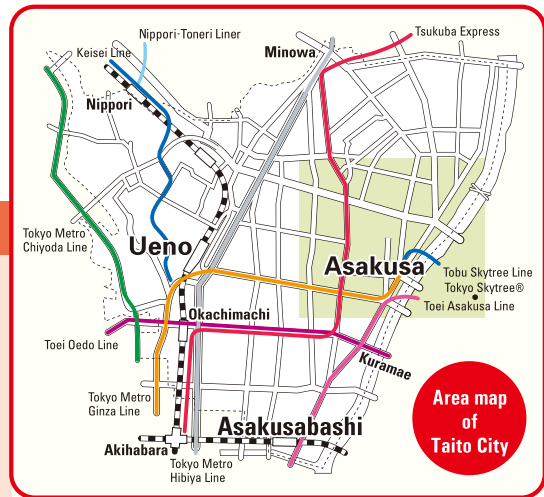

The finest part of Asakusa is centered around the several blocks surrounding the centuries-old Asakusa Kannon Temple, or Sensoji, which itself is the main attraction of the area. Come and feel the old-world charm of the commercial and entertainment center of the Edo times, and enjoy the lively lifestyle of the locals of both today and the old days.

Kaminarimon Gate

Sensoji Temple 浅草寺



Tokyo's oldest Buddhist temple for common people. It has attracted widespread popularity with its affectionate appellation for the merciful goddess of Kannon, "Asakusa no Kannon-sama". Inside its precincts, fairs and markets are open to sell various goods such as ground cherries and battledores to its many visitors. The gate "Kaminarimon", symbol of Asakusa, is the main gate to the temple.

Asakusa Shrine 浅草神社



Dedicated to Hajino Nakatomo and the Hinokuma brothers, Hamanari and Takenari, who found and came to understand the miracle-working power of the principal image of the Sensoji Temple. In 1649, the shrine pavilion of classic architectural style, or Gongen-zukuri, was dedicated by Tokugawa Iemitsu, third tycoon of the Tokugawa Shogunate, and has been designated as a nationally important cultural property. The annual shrine festival "Sanja Matsuri", one of the three biggest festivals the Edo era, is still held every May.

Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center 浅草文化観光センター



The Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center is a tourist information facility in Taito City, found in front of the Asakusa Kaminarimon gate. We provide useful information and services to the great many visitors to Taito City based on the concept of "Finding, Showing and Supporting." On the first floor there are a tourist information counter and an Exchange booth. On the second floor there is a PC area with free Wi-Fi. And on the top floor there is an observation deck and a Café.

Open to both cooking enthusiasts and professionals, this street always bustles with a crowd looking for convenient kitchenware.
